The Head of Ahmadiyya Muslim Community Calls on Muslims to Adopt Precautionary Measures to Curb the Spread of Coronavirus

Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad says that Islamic teachings require Muslims to maintain personal hygiene and to avoid unnecessary physical contact

Following the outbreak of the Coronavirus, the World Head of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, the Fifth Khalifa (Caliph), His Holiness, Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad has instructed Ahmadi Muslims to adopt all measures recommended by health authorities to help curb the spread of the virus.

Speaking at the Baitul Futuh Mosque in London, during his Friday Sermon delivered on 6 March 2020, His Holiness said that it was appropriate to avoid large gatherings during the current outbreak and instructed Ahmadi Muslims to refrain from attending their Mosques if they developed any symptoms associated with the coronavirus.

Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad said:

“It is very important to act upon the precautionary measures that are being announced [by the health authorities]. Large gatherings should be avoided and those coming to the Mosque should also take special care. If anyone shows any signs of a slight fever, flu or body-ache, sneezing or other symptoms then they should not come to the Mosque. Mosques have rights upon the people that visit them. It is the right of the Mosque that no one should attend who can affect other attendees of the Mosque with a contagious illness. Those with contagious diseases should especially take care to avoid Mosques.”

Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad said:

“Doctors are advising that hands should be washed regularly and hand sanitisers should be used. If one’s hands are dirty, they should avoid contact with the face until cleaned. This should be followed but, regardless, for us as Muslims, if someone prays five times a day, they will wash themselves properly five times a day through ablation and amongst other things, will be running clean water through their hands and nose, which ensures personal hygiene is maintained at all times and will reduce the need for hand sanitisers that are already reported to be in short supply.”

The World Head of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community, the Fifth Khalifa (Caliph), His Holiness, Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad has written a series of letters to various world leaders urging them to consider the paralysing and devastating effects of Covid-19 as a Divine warning for mankind.

The historic letters, sent during the month of June 2020, were written to leaders of 14 countries – Australia, Canada, China, France, Germany, Ghana, India, Israel, Japan, Nigeria, Russia, Sierra Leone, the United Kingdom and the United States of America.

Letters were also written to Pope Francis and the UN Secretary General, His Excellency António Guterres.

Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad said:

“As a religious leader and a person of faith, I believe that the tribulations of the past few weeks have occurred according to the Decree of God Almighty and as a grave warning to mankind to reform and to forgo all forms of injustice and cruelty. This pandemic is a glaring message to mankind directing the people of the world to turn towards God Almighty and to fulfil His rights and those of our fellow human beings.”

Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad continued:

“In light of the prevailing circumstances, it is my sincere and humble request that where your government is forming and enacting policies to stop the spread of the coronavirus, as the leader of your nation, you should also encourage the citizens of your country to fulfil the rights of one another and to be ready to make personal sacrifices in the cause of humanity. Similarly, your government should strive to ensure the peace and security of society, both within your country and at a broader, international level. I sincerely request that you uphold the demands of justice and integrity by seeking to fulfil the rights of your own people and of all other nations.”

His Holiness presided the meeting from his office in Islamabad, Tilford, whilst the Amila representatives were gathered at the Khilafat Hall at the Baitul Huda Mosque complex (national headquarters) at Marsden Park, a suburb in the Greater Sydney region.

Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad said:

“One point I wish to make to all the members of the Lajna administration is that simply to work hard yourself is not representative of true success or excellence. Of course, to personally work hard is a good quality and of value, however if you have not cultivated and developed a team – a second line who can follow you and ensure that the work of your department progresses smoothly after your term ends – it means you have actually not achieved anything at all.”

Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad continued:

“As I said, to only work hard personally is not the objective, rather your objective is to make such an excellent team so that when your term ends others will be ready to assume the duties of your respective department or office. Regardless of your age, whether you are young or old, you must develop and train others and this spirit of work should be instilled within every office bearer of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community at every level.”


Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad said:

“Allah has not created anything in vain. No part of creation is useless. For example, a scorpion’s venom has been used in certain medicines. The same is true of snake venom, which has been used in homeopathy. There are other medicines that have been developed using insects or creatures that might otherwise have been considered useless. So there are quite a number of things which though we may not understand their purpose, Allah has instilled within them some purpose and so none of His creation is useless.”

Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad continued:

“The Promised Messiah (peace be upon him) said that he did not like for parents to unnecessarily scold their children over petty things. Rather he taught they should show patience and should pray for their children that Allah the Almighty may reform them and remove their shortcomings and the problems they have.”

The Promised Messiah(as) also wrote that one must establish brotherhood amongst themselves and abandon all enmity and mockery. Establish a relationship with God and enter into the fold of His mercy. If one takes it upon himself to fulfil the commandments of God then He will remove hardships from their path. Just as a farmer cares only for those trees of luxuriant growth and bear fruit, and cares not for such trees which are barren and bear no fruit. Thus God cares for those who prove true in striving for His cause and in His way. So eliminate harshness amongst yourselves and establish kindness and compassion.

The Promised Messiah(as) said that compassion towards others is a great form of worshipping God. As for those who have been blessed with the grace of God, one of the greatest ways to express gratitude for this is to serve His creation.

His Holiness(aba) read another passage in which the Promised Messiah(as) said that our community should be such that it does not limit itself to mere words, but fulfils that true tenants of the pledge of allegiance. If a true inner change is not brought about, then there is no difference between us and others. Just as one goes to the doctor to cure his illnesses, one should seek to attain righteousness with the same urgency.



Defence Against the Plague and a Criterion for the Elect of God

The third plague pandemic claimed millions of lives in India, and raged with particular intensity in the Punjab province. By 1902, it had encroached within a few miles of the environs of Qadian.

Twenty-two years earlier, the Promised Messiah, Mirza Ghulam Ahmad(as) of Qadian, had prophesied the outbreak of such a plague. He boldly proclaimed on the basis of the divine revelation that, as a sight of his truthfulness, God would safeguard Qadian — even though it lay directly in the path of this ravaging disease. The Promised Messiah(as) also pointed out that God had foretold in previous holy scriptures that He would send a severe plague as a warning in the Latter Days, when the Promised Messiah would appear.

In Defence Against the Plague, the Promised Messiah^(as) reviews various proposals put forward to fight the bubonic plague, and then prescribes the true method for deliverance — that people should reform themselves and accept the Promised Messiah(as) commissioned by God.
